

TRIP IDEAS

Pasadena

By rail

- Take Metrolink heading west towards Union Station, then transfer to the Gold Line towards Sierra Madre Valley/Pasadena.
- 2 hours/\$17 roundtrip

By bus

- 187 (heading west towards Raymond and Walnut) to the Sierra Madre station on the Gold Line, or 187 all the way to downtown Pasadena (Colorado Blvd. and Garfield Ave.).
- 2 hours/\$2.50 roundtrip

Victoria Gardens

By rail

- Take Metrolink headed east towards San Bernardino, get off at the Fontana station and take the 66 bus towards Montclair. Get off at Foothill and Day Creek, walk east to Monet Ave. then north until you reach the mall.
- 1 hour-1 hour, 40 minutes/\$16 roundtrip

By bus

- Walk to the Montclair transit center, then take the 66 bus to Foothill and Day Creek. Walk east to Monet Ave. then north until you reach the mall.
- 2 hours/\$3 roundtrip

LACMA

By rail

- Take Metrolink west to Union Station, transfer to the Purple Line to the Wilshire/Western station. Transfer to the 20 bus and take to Wilshire/Spaulding.
- 90-120 minutes/\$14 roundtrip weekends

Airports

ONT Airport

By rail: Take Metrolink east to Montclair and take the 80 bus to Vineyard and Holt (requires some walking).

LAX Airport

By rail: Take Metrolink to Union Station, transfer to FlyAway airport shuttle.
By rail: Take Metrolink to Union Station, transfer to Bus 445 then to Green Line. Get off at Aviation for the free LAX shuttle.



A QUICK GUIDE TO PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION



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GENERAL INFORMATION

Metrolink

Metrolink consists of seven rail lines converging at Union Station in Los Angeles, the central hub for bus, Amtrak, and subway lines. The Claremont Metrolink station is part of the San Bernardino Line, which stops in many of the surrounding cities between San Bernardino and LA Union Station. Claremont's central location also makes the Metrolink a viable means of transportation to Montclair, Upland, Rancho Cucamonga, Fontana, Rialto, and San Bernardino.

Bus Lines (Foothill Transit)

Foothill Transit operates the local bus lines which run throughout the Inland Valley.

Silver Streak

The Silver Streak is a cheaper alternative to the Metrolink if you need to get to LA. The bus is accessible from both the Montclair and Pomona transit stations and runs through East LA, Union Station, and Downtown LA.

Why use public transportation?

Transportation is responsible for 32% of CO2 emissions in the US and is the second largest source of greenhouse gases. As a result our transportation choices combine to have a much larger environmental impact than many of us assume.

Currently public transportation helps save approximately 1.4 billion gallons of gasoline and 1.5 million tons of CO2 annually, yet only 14% of Americans use public transportation daily and 88% of all trips are made by car, often carrying only one person. By increasing your public transportation usage you can help curb unsustainable CO2 usage. Expanding your usage of public transportation will also lead to societal benefits such as a reduction of public health contaminants such as airborne toxins - one of the leading causes of respiratory illnesses, especially in low-income communities around freeways.

Claremont's proximity to Metrolink and numerous bus lines makes public transportation a relatively easy option for getting out and exploring LA or the surrounding areas.

Once in LA

The Metro Rail Lines compose the subway system for the LA Region, stretching from Pasadena to Long Beach.

- **Metro Red Line:** Travels from LA Union Station west through North Hollywood.
- **Metro Gold Line:** Travels from LA Union Station east into Pasadena.
- **Metro Purple Line:** Travels from LA Union Station through Downtown LA to the Wilshire/Western intersection.
- **Metro Blue Line:** Travels from the 7th St./Metro Center of the Red or Purple Lines in Downtown LA to Long Beach.
- **Metro Green Line:** Travels from Norwalk to Redondo Beach, reachable from the Blue Line. A free shuttle also takes passengers from the LAX stop on the Green Line to LAX.

Cost: \$1.25 one way/ \$5 for daylong pass
