



Overview

- Designed by Machado Silvetti and Gensler
- Total cost: \$44 million
- Cornerstone donor: Janet Inskeep Benton (Pomona '79) with gift of \$15 million
- Three times the gallery space of previous Montgomery Art Center
- State-of-the-art smart study rooms
- First time in museum's history that staff and collection are under one roof



Schedule

- Groundbreaking: November 4, 2017
- Completion: June 2019
- Installation: September 2019–March 2020
- “Soft” Opening (viewing by appointment): May 2021
- Opening Celebration: Fall 2021

Building Facts

- Total square footage: 33,331 sq ft
- Building materials (including recycled and locally sourced): Cast-in-place concrete, red clay tiles, red cedar, bronze
- Multiple entrances to serve campus and community
- 5,100 sq ft of gallery space across 6 flexible galleries (largest at 1,500 sq ft)
- 900 sq ft events pavilion with 12.5 ft tall sliding doors that open completely to the courtyard
- 2,000 sq ft painting collection vault
- 1,600 sq ft collection storage for Native American collection

- 1,300 sq ft collection storage for works on paper
- Offices, work areas, and archive room
- Outdoor sculptures, including special commission by Alison Saar, *Imbue*
- Succulent garden
- Wrap-around porticos
- Art hallway open to the courtyard
- Art patio that houses “Untitled” by Chris Burden ’69
- “Reading room” with natural light, seating, and exhibition space
- 7 gender neutral bathrooms
- LEED Gold status with one of the lowest Energy Use Intensity scores of any museum built in California in the last decade
