- The Profile can be waived by the Office of Financial Aid if:
 - o The student is eligible to file the FAFSA *and*
 - o Parents are eligible to file the 1040A or 1040EZ federal tax return *and*
 - o The family's total annual household income is less than \$40,000, *and*
 - o Total family assets are less than \$50,000 (including your primary home)
